County Charter Amendments – Measure A: Creates an independent Ethics Commission, Budget Analyst, and Program Auditor, mandates public disclosure of spending, revises supervisor to three four year term limits, and requires Board confirmation for certain executive appointments.	Vote YES
County Health & Safety Act — Measure B: A ½ cent sales tax measure allocating funds for infrastructure to combat the Tijuana sewage crisis, expand access to affordable healthcare, wildfire prevention, and public safety.	Vote YES
Grossmnt Cuy Com College Bond Measure – Measure G: Funds critical school repairs and renovations without raising taxes.	Vote YES  KEY CAMPAIGN
San Diego Unified Bond Measure – Measure M: Funds critical school repairs and renovations without raising taxes.	Vote YES  KEY CAMPAIGN

State Propositions

Prop 1: Authorizes \$11.25 billion in bonds for housing affordability programs, including multi-family rental housing, mortgages for veterans, supportive housing, preservation of affordable housing, and down payment assistance.	Vote YES

Prop 2: Increases California's Rainy Day Fund, approved by voters in 2014, to provide funding for education, health care, public safety, and other essential services during economic downturn.	Vote YES
Prop 3: Provides permanent funding for schools and health care by extending tax on high incomes.	Vote YES
Prop 4: Allows for public funding of state and local election campaigns in California.	Vote YES
Prop 5: Eliminates the successor election when a state officer is recalled, effectively leaving the office vacant until it is filled according to state law.	Vote YES
Prop 37: Creates a loan program for middle-income buyers of qualified new homes.	Vote YES
Prop 38: Authorizes the state's ability to issue \$8.4 billion in General Obligation bonds to fund immunology and immunotherapy research.	No Recommendation
Prop 39: Creates costly and unnecessary barriers that for eligible California voters, exposes personal information to identity theft, and waste hundreds of millions in taxpayer dollars.	Vote NO
Prop 40: Approves a one-time 5% tax on billionaires to fund health care, education, and food assistance programs.	Vote YES
Prop 41: An attempt by a few billionaires to undermine Proposition 40 in order to avoid paying excessive wealth taxes.	Vote NO
Prop 42: A billionaire-funded ploy to prohibit voters from taxing billionaires— it has nothing to do with protecting your retirement.	Vote NO
Prop 43: Limits voters' ability to fund essential local services including fire protection, 911 response, schools, roads, hospitals and affordable housing.	Vote NO
Prop 44: Requires certain private nonprofit health care clinics to spend at least 90% of their revenue each year on providing health care services.	Vote YES
Prop 45: Destroys any guarantee of prevailing wage, threatens labor protections, and silences workers by prohibiting participation in the discussion of critical projects.	Vote NO ← KEY CAMPAIGN

WHAT AN ENDORSEMENT MEANS: Your local union's representatives have participated at the local level through the San Diego County Building & Construction Trades Council and/or the San Diego & Imperial Counties Labor Council endorsement processes as well as at the state level through the California State Building Trades Council and/or the California Labor Federation. These processes include research, interviews of candidates and issues advocates, and votes by delegate and executive board bodies to determine whether a candidate or ballot measure should receive a labor endorsement. Candidates must answer detailed questionnaires that they support the values and work of labor unions and their members. **If there is a race or issue that is not on this card, but is on your ballot,** it means candidates or advocates for the issue did not seek or receive an endorsement from the San Diego Building Trades Council or the San Diego & Imperial Counties Labor Council. **Tuesday, November 3, 2026** is the deadline to register to vote in person. In order to register to vote in person, you must go to the Registrar of Voters office at 5600 Overland Ave, San Diego, CA 92123. Complete a conditional voter registration form and submit it. You will get a ballot and a green CVR provisional envelope. Mark your choices on the ballot, place it in the envelope, and seal it. Print and sign your name, and date the envelope. Once your conditional voter registration form is verified and it is confirmed you did not vote elsewhere in the state for the current election, your registration will become active. Your ballot will be removed from the CVR provisional envelope and your votes will be counted. **WHO CAN VOTE?** To register to vote in California, you must: be a citizen of the United States, be a resident of California, be at least 18 years or older on Election Day, not be currently in state or federal prison or on parole for the conviction of a felony, not be currently found to be mentally incompetent to vote by a court.
